PURPOSE OF THE DIARY

Parents are free to use the pages of this diary to comment upon student's progress in studies and his conduct. Suggestions for improvement in any school programme are always welcome. We look forward to parents' continued co-operation.

- Always remembers that the school is judged by the conduct of its pupils and therefore is disciplined, polite and courteous.

SCHOOL RULES

1. Students must behave properly. humbly and respectfully to all elders, teachers, school staff, parents, peers and juniors in and out of the campus.
2. Every student must bring his/her School Almanac to School daily and show on demand.
3. Students must be habitually clean and always be neatly dressed.
4. All boys must keep their hair short. Girls must tie their hair neatly with a black Ribbon/Band.
5. Lending or borrowing money or other articles is not permitted
6. Parents can meet the subject teachers before or after the class hours only with prior appointment.
7. Burning crackers or splashing colors during Diwali/Holi or on any other day in the school premises is strictly forbidden. Non-compliance of these instructions can result in expulsion from the school.
8. The name,class and section of the pupils should be clearly marked on all belongings of the student.
9. School Appointments, Monitors, Duty Students, Scholars etc. should wear their respective badges daily. A fine of Rs. 50/-shall be charged if a child loses his/her badge.
10. All students are expected to arrive on time. Students who arrive late for more than 5 minutes may be denied entry and late entry shall be recorded in his/her Almanac.
11. A student must not participate or indulge in any act of violence committed by other students which harms any student physically or mentally.
12. Parents/guardians of all students must attend PTM on the days assigned. PTM's are scheduled to discuss the progress of their ward.
13. The School reserves to itself the right to expel any student whose diligence or progress in studies is frequently unsatisfactory or whose conduct is harmful to other students.

14. Any kind of toys, electronic gadgets, mobile phones, watches, gold jewellery or sharp articles etc. are not allowed in the school and shall be liable to be confiscated. In case of loss of valuables, the authority shall not be held responsible for the loss.
15. Students are not allowed to wear coloured dresses on their birthdays from Class VI onwards. Birthdays can be celebrated only by distribution of sweets/toffees.
16. Use of foul language and deceitful behaviour will be considered a major offence and can lead to suspension of the child from the school.

17. Change of Address Telephone or Emergency Contacts

The school must have correct and updated information about each student to maintain communication with the parents. The parents must immediately inform the Principal and school office of any change in their address, official residence or emergency contact numbers.

18. The Principal of the school may recommend withdrawal of a student from the school, if the student's behaviour or influence on others is considered detrimental to the general discipline and interest of the school. The recommendations would be put on to the Management members for final decision.
19. **Disciplinary Action:** In a situation where a child is not meeting the required expectations of behaviour, it is our aim to use positive reinforcement and incentive wherever possible. However, there are times when limits need to be reinforced and punishments issued in order to change the behaviour which does not meet expectations. For the first time of any type of misbehaviour relating to any of the above mentioned policies the same will be entered in the Student's file with the consent of the Principal and a first warning will be given. On the second occasion of any misbehaviour, the parent will be intimated, besides entering the same in the student's file and second warning be given. On the third time of misbehaviour, suitable disciplinary action will be taken, including termination.

SCHOOL TRANSPORT

- Students can avail School Transport subject to the availability of seats. The pick up and drop off points are fixed by the school and change of route is not permitted without the approval of the school authorities.
- Bus charges are payable for 11 months as per approved bus fee. Parents are requested to see that the students are escorted to and from the bus stop. The escorts should be at the bus stop ten minutes before the expected arrival of the bus.
- In the event of breakdown of the bus or failure to ply on a specified day, parents shall make arrangements for their wards to reach the school.
- Although all precautions are taken for the student, the school cannot be held responsible for any injury, accident or loss of life.
- If a student is constantly misbehaving in the bus or is found deliberately damaging bus fittings, he can be debarred from availing the bus service and suitable disciplinary action shall be taken.
- Parents who make independent transport arrangement for their ward by hiring vans/rickshaws etc.-
 - (a) Will be fully responsible for the same. They must ensure that proper verification of drivers, rickshaw pullers is done and all safety measures have been taken to avoid any untoward incident.
 - (b) The vehicle is in good condition.
 - (c) The vehicle is not LPG operated.
 - (d) The authorized driver has at least 5 year's driving experience and the police verification of the driver is done.
 - (e) The telephone numbers of co-parents are kept by each parent using that vehicle.
 - (f) There should be a designated lady guard or trained attendants to supervise and safe guard the children.

Withdrawal from School/Bus Facility

- While withdrawing a child for any reason, parents need to give one month's notice or one month's fee in lieu of.
- Request for withdrawal of Transport facility will not be accepted after the month of **October**. If the student avails the Transport facility upto November, Transport charges from December to March will not be removed from fee bill, even if he/she stops using the bus facility. However, the school may consider under unavoidable circumstance, if sufficient documentary evidence is submitted.
- Withdrawal of bus facility for Class X & XII is not permissible till the month of **February** of the ongoing session.

RULES CONCERNING ABSENCE, WITHDRAWAL AND REMOVAL

1. No leave of absence is granted except on prior written application from parents or guardians and even then for plausible reasons only.
2. Parents are requested to send a leave application if the child has to be absent for a day or more.
3. Every absence (due to sickness or other unavoidable emergencies) must be entered briefly in the Leave and Absence Record pages of the almanac and must be signed by the parent or guardians. A student who is on unauthorized leave or absence continuously for more than 15 days at a time without any intimation is liable to be struck off the rolls.
4. A student returning to school after suffering from an infectious or contagious disease should produce a doctor's certificate, permitting him/her to attend school and certifying that the child has observed the required period of quarantine before returning to the class. Medical Leave (ML) to be submitted within 10 days from the joining date. No ML will be considered thereafter.
5. Strict action will be taken as per CBSE guidelines if he/she is found using unfair means during the examination.

WITHDRAWALS

- Parents must apply for a TC **at least two weeks in advance**.
- TC will be issued **only after clearance of all dues**.
- Duplicate TCs are **not normally issued**.
- A duplicate TC may be issued only in **exceptional cases**, upon submission of an **affidavit stating that the original TC is irrecoverably lost**.
- Responsibility for any misuse of the duplicate TC will **rest with the parent**.
- Parents requiring any certificate for their ward must submit a request to the Principal **at least 5 days in advance** to avoid delays.

- Parents paying fees online should log in to the **Parent Portal** (vbpsdwarka.accevat.co)
- Direct fee payment link is available through the school **website** (<https://www.vbpsdwarka.com>)
- Fees may be **paid Online (Credit Card, Debit Card, Net Banking, and UPI), Cheque, or Demand Draft.**
- **Cash payment is not accepted** by the school office.
- The **student's Name, Class, Section, Admission Number, and Mobile Number** must be written on the back of the cheque.
- **No Post-Dated cheque will be accepted by the school.**
- Any discrepancy in the fee bill should be reported to the school email within **10 working days.**
- Transport fees will also be charged to students admitted under the **EWS category** if they avail the facility.
- If an online payment is debited but not reflected in the portal, parents **should not make another payment.**
- The transaction will be updated manually after confirmation from the bank (may take at least **three working days**).
- **Fee payment for the last quarter (Jan-March) must be cleared by 20th January to complete clearance formalities.**
- **Quarter 4 payment must be made through Online mode only.**
- **No cheque payment will be accepted for this quarter.**

3. Late fee will be charged @ Rs 20/- per day after the last date till the 10th of following month.
4. Student's name will be struck off from the rolls if the fee along with late fee is not deposited within 30 Days after expiry of the due date.
5. The schedule for payment of bus fee can be procured from the school by those who opt for school Transport.
6. In case a cheque is dishonoured, the facility of paying by cheque will be withdrawn. Furthermore, the fee delayed due to this dishonoring will be accepted by Demand Draft along with late fee charges accrued therein .

LIBRARY RULES

The school library is well equipped with books of interest for children of all classes. Every year, we update the library with the latest books and journals. All students are encouraged to make full use of the library facilities available to add on to their knowledge as well as spend their spare time fruitfully.

- Students must maintain complete silence in the library.
- They must carry a Library Card duly signed by the Librarian. Books are issued only against this card.
- Students are allowed to borrow book on their own card only.
- Students from Class VI onwards can borrow only one book at a time and retain it for a period of seven days. Those who do not return the book in time will be fined Rs. 5.00 per day per book.
- Reference books will be issued only during school hours for use in the library only.

- If the student wishes to keep a book for a longer time, they have to get it re-issued. The books may be re-issued for a second time, if that book does not have any demand by other students.
- The library has 'open access' system. The children can select their own shelves. They must, however, put the books back on the same shelf after reading/ selecting the books.
- Students are not allowed to bring their personal books or belongings in the library. Marking, underlining or annotating in the library book is strictly forbidden.
- Borrowers are required to examine the books at the time of borrowing and inform librarian about the damage.
- Books lost, damaged or wrongly handled will have to be paid for or replaced. The discretion of the Principal in this matter shall be final and binding.
- All library books must be returned to the librarian before the final exams.
- Duplicate library card may be issued on payment of Rs 20/-
- Books are issued and returned only during library period.
- If a book is lost fine (equivalent to book cost) will be imposed on the student.
- News, paper journals and periodicals are to be referred in the library.
- Students are advised not to give books to others on their names.

HOW PARENTS CAN HELP THE SCHOOL

General Guidelines to Parent

- Parents must ensure that their ward is regular to the School
- Student's personal data and medical record in the school's almanac should be filled in correctly, promptly and completely in duplicate too. Parents must also enter their specimen signatures in the personal data.
- Not to enter classroom either to see their children or to meet the teacher during school hours.
- To attend the PTM as per the schedule given in the School almanac.
- To co-operate with the school by paying attention to their ward's punctuality, regularity and discipline.
- To send their children to school in proper school uniform and ensure that the child is neat and tidy.

- To check the almanac every day and note the home work assigned to the child or for any other instruction and ensure follow up action.
- To check the bags of their wards to see if any notice, circular, invitation etc. has been issued. A record of worksheets and circular must be maintained at home.
- To inform the school if there is any change of address and telephone no. (Shared through ERP app)
- To avoid half day leave of child, as far as possible for security reasons. However, in any emergency, written permission must be taken from the class teacher and the Principal.
- Leave record pages must be duly filled if the child does not attend the school for any reason. Student with less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to sit for the final examination.
- No stranger/relative is allowed to meet the children during school hours. Parents must read the circulars carefully and consult the school almanac before making enquiries on the telephone.
- See that your ward carries books, exercise note books etc. according to the time table to avoid heavy bags. Send Scholar's Almanac to school every day.
- Not to send your ward to school with costly gadgets accessories mobiles.
- No child will be allowed to leave the school after PT exam as regular school will be followed.
- Be supportive of teacher's actions in dealing with your ward and also avoid undermining them in the eyes of their ward by passing comments about individual teacher or the teaching profession in general.
- Positive and co-operative attitude of parents will be highly appreciable. Don't send your ward empty stomach to school.

Assessment will be done on the basis of Written Test, Oral Presentation, Activity Book, Portfolio, Teacher's observation during activities.

Academic Excellence Award

Students securing 91% and above in the overall academic results will be eligible for the Academic Excellence Certificate. However, the code of conduct will be taken into consideration before awarding students.

RETEST POLICY for Periodic Tests (PTs) under exceptional circumstances:

- Participation in recognised events (sports, NCC/NSS, etc., with permission).
- Poor academic performance.

Required Documentation

Students must submit the following to apply for a retest:

- Valid medical certificate (where applicable)
- Written application/notification submitted within the stipulated time
- Supporting official documents in case of serious emergencies or event participation at school level

Requests without proper documentation will not be considered.

Promotion Policy

1. Eligibility for Promotion

- Students must secure a minimum of 40% overall mark(Term 1 and Term 2) in each subject to be eligible for promotion to the next class.
- Students who do not meet the passing criteria in one or more subjects will be given an opportunity to appear for a Re-Examination (Retest) in the concerned subject(s).
- Re-Examination will be conducted on the same syllabus and pattern as of Annual Examination.
- Each student must maintain attendance of 75% for the whole academic year.
- If a student is caught in engaging in unfair means during an examination, a new answer sheet will be provided to complete the paper within the time.

2. Re-Examination Passing Criteria

To be declared Pass after re-examination, a student must:

- Secure the minimum qualifying marks in the re-exam component (e.g., 33%), and
- Achieve an overall minimum of 40% in the subject after combining all assessment components.
- Both conditions must be fulfilled to qualify as pass.

3. Failure After Re-Examination (Essential Repeat / Detention)

If a student of class V& VIII fails to meet the required criteria even after the re-examination, the student may be placed under Essential Repeat or Detention in the same class for the following academic year. No provision of further repeat in the same class.
